

A one-year full-time study load for a Monash undergraduate course is usually 48 credit points (24 points per semester). A standard three year degree is usually 144 credit points in total, but Monash University also offers a number of longer and double degrees.

Pathways for Box Hill students applying to Monash University

Applying

- Applicants must have completed an advanced certificate (Certificate IV or above) or the first year of a diploma to a satisfactory standard.
- Applicants must also meet the university's minimum English entry requirements.
- Scored or graded results are required. Assessment results in the form of pass/fail or competent/noncompetent only, will not be considered as part of the selection process. However, where graded or scored results are not available, applicants should provide additional scored information, which can be considered and may enhance selection prospects.
- Applicants must ensure that they have met any specified prerequisite studies or their equivalent for their course of interest. It is therefore best to choose studies that relate to your course of interest or enable you to meet the course prerequisites. Some faculties may have additional entry requirements such as interviews and folios. See VTAC Guide or the Monash Course Finder for more details.

Credit

- In some cases, you may receive credit towards your Monash degree based on your Box Hill studies. Once accepted into a Monash course, you can apply for credit for your previous studies.
- A full time load for a Monash undergraduate course is usually 48 credit points (24 credit points per semester). Three year degrees are usually 144 credit points in total, but Monash also offers a number of longer and double degrees.

How to apply

Australian students

Australian citizens, holders of an Australian permanent residents visa and New Zealand citizens applying for most undergraduate courses and the Graduate Diploma of Education must apply through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).
